Up to 32 hrs per week, during the months of June through August with the possibility of extending internship after August

Summary

This position provides a college undergrad or graduate student with an excellent opportunity to gain significant experience with a nonprofit organization that works to advance state level public policy to incorporate healthy eating and physical activity standards into out of school time programs. Under the guidance of the Director of Health and Wellness, the HEPA Intern will learn through experience about what is involved in running a successful state level campaign while building field support of HEPA in out of school. (S)he will work closely with the policy team.

Responsibilities and Tasks

- Schedule and coordinate materials for coalition meetings
- Update and maintain a library of HEPA related success stories.
- Update website content, including writing blogs and top news for homepage.
- Conduct research on local jurisdictions' passage of laws or regulation to incorporate healthy eating and physical activity into out of school time programs
- Recruitment of advocates and organizations to sign up for Action Center
- Track state HEPA related state legislation
- Perform other support duties as requested.
