The Afterschool Alliance announced the selection of Carla Allard, Coordinator of *The Learning Zone* which is an afterschool program serving alternative school youth from the Rapid City School District, to serve as a 2010-2011 Afterschool Ambassador.

Carla, along with all Ambassadors throughout the country, will continue directing or supporting a local afterschool program while also serving a one-year Afterschool Ambassador term organizing public events, communicating with policy makers, and building support for afterschool programs.

A Lights On Afterschool Ceremony in South Dakota will be held at Mt. Rushmore on October 16 starting at 6 PM. The public is invited to attend. There will be a chili feed, special program and lighting ceremony, and an honoring of quality after-school providers.

The Learning Zone is funded through a competitive grant process from the South Dakota Department of Education. Black Hills Special Services Cooperative is the recipient of this funding and has been instrumental in securing funds for various afterschool programs in Western South Dakota. The Learning Zone provides over 350 alternative school students with afterschool academic support, career counseling and postsecondary education preparation assistance to high school students enrolled in the Academies at the Rapid City Area School.

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
