Dean Kamen, the founder of *FIRST*©, a nationwide afterschool program that helps young people discover the excitement and rewards of science and technology will add his voice to those of hundreds of parents, children, educators and policy makers in calling for Congress to preserve afterschool funding and expand opportunities for children to learn about the sciences and math in afterschool programs at the Afterschool Alliance's *Afterschool for All Challenge*, May 16 and 17. The tenth annual *Afterschool for All Challenge* is highlighting the importance of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) learning, in recognition of 2011 being the Year of Science in Afterschool.
