

- Situated in urban centers, <u>Hive Learning Networks</u> re-imagine how learning is organized and supported across youth-serving organizations. Through deliberate coordination and active mentors, Hive participants create learning opportunities that connect the three spheres of youth influence: peer culture, interests, and academics.
